What is the Challenge?

Why take the 10 to 100 challenge for S.A.L.V.E.?

S.A.L.V.E. is a small UK and Ugandan charity working hard to reduce the number of young people on the streets of Jinja, Uganda through education. We support children living on the streets to return to their families (or another loving family) and to re-enter education. We have successfully resettled over 190 children to a safe family home since we began in 2008. Where it is not possible to arrange for the child to be resettled home straight away we provide a caring place for the child at the S.A.L.V.E.

Rehabilitation Home and support the child's education whilst working towards their future family resettlement.



We believe that:

- ❖ No young person should have to live or work on the street.
- ❖ Young people who have lived on the street deserve the chance to fulfil their potential.
- ❖ Young people on the street should have trustworthy supportive adults around them.

We may be small, but we have big ambitions. With your help we can achieve them.

Idea's for turning 10 into 100

Make and sell Christmas cards — Use your £10 to invest in some card, glitter, pens etc and get making. Let your friends and family know in advance and get their orders in.



Sell your skills — Do you have a skill that you could sell to raise money for S.A.L.V.E.? For example, are you a trained manicurist? Could you offer manicures and donate the earnings to S.A.L.V.E. using the £10 to purchase nail varnish etc



Get baking — Do you enjoy baking? Then why not make and sell Christmas cakes, mince pies or Christmas Puddings this year? You could take orders in advance or ask if you can have a cake sale at work one day.

Quiz Night — If you and your friends love to put your general knowledge to the test then why not organise a Christmas quiz? You could approach your local pub to see if they would be interested in running it for you or just invite your friends over and ask for a donation.

Hold a raffle — Ask for donations from local organisations and then sell raffle tickets to friends and family. If you sell 100 tickets you will have made your £100 easily. Local spa's are often willing to donate prizes as are cinemas and many restaraunts.

Sell your Art — Are you creative? Do you make your own home made crafts? Are you an artist? Then why not sell your items and donate the money to S.A.L.V.E. as part of the challenge?
