Introduction

A little bit about S.A.L.V.E International...

Founded in February 2008, S.A.L.V.E. International (Support and Love Via Education) is a community based organisation that works with children living on the streets of Jinja. Our motivation is to reduce the number of children in the streets by helping them re-enter education and re-unite with their families.

The purpose of the research you have been involved with was to map out the organisations, schools and vocational training centers working in Kyamagwa, Wakitaka, Namulesa and Nakabango.

How will it be useful to you?

Often when we are working in the community, we are approached by members of that community in need of services that we are unfortunately unable to provide. We are aware that there are many organisations, schools and vocational training centers providing a range of services to meet the needs of the local community and we wanted to come up with a directory of these organisations so that in the future, when we come across someone in need of a service we are unable to provide, we can refer them to an organisation who may be able to offer them the support they need.

We want to create a network of information that will help both S.A.L.V.E, and other organisations and schools achieve a mutual goal of reducing the number of children living on the streets.



A committee of local parents identify children in the community, from the ages of 5-6, who are particularly disadvantaged, and recruit a cohort of 30 to join the nursery each year.

Admission is based on background only - there are no religious requirements or entrance exams.


Age ranges:

Nursery students are from 5-6 years old. The school offers years P1-P7

Gender ratio: 5:4 girls to boys. Recruitment often slightly favours girls because they more often fit the recruitment criteria, possibly due to lack of priority of girls' education by parents.

Fees:

There are no fees for attending St. Agnes. The school is sponsored by a family in the Netherlands. The cost for tuition fees, uniforms,



meals, and scholastic materials are all covered by this sponsorship.

Facilities:

Classrooms, library and good access to books, playground.

Subjects:

English, maths, combined science, social studies, religious studies, art, music, drama, dance, sport.

Extracurricular clubs:

Music club, games club, debating club.

Typical progression:

The majority of students in P7 proceed on to secondary school. The highest achieving students in P7 sometimes have their secondary fees sponsored by the Dutch family.

Specifically, students often go to St. Johns
Secondary School, as well as vocational centers in the area.


