# Introduction

S.A.L.V.E International is a charity that works with children living on the streets of Jinja, Uganda. S.A.L.V.E. helps children to leave the streets and return home to their family and re-enter education. Currently S.A.L.V.E has a Halfway Home, an Emergency Home and a Drug Rehabilitation Centre located in Namalesa Wakalenge. S.A.L.V.E. also trains the young people we work with how to make briquettes; a sustainable alternative to charcoal.

The goal of the research carried out in July and August 2017 has been to identify and map out the schools, organisations and vocational training centres working in and around the area of Walukuba. This mapping is vital to the work of S.A.L.V.E and their ability to help people in the community as it helps to integrate the knowledge and awareness of the many organisations and institutions providing services within the area. We also hope that the research will create strong partnerships and a network of organisations working within the area.

It is hoped that the directory that we are creating of Walukuba and areas around Jinja can be used to help others in need if S.A.L.V.E is unable to help. We also hope that this research will not only benefit the work of S.A.L.V.E but also the schools, organisations and vocational institutions involved.

In conjunction with this directory, we have created an online map of all of the institutions contacted throughout our research, which we hope can be utilised. We hope that this map can be built upon, with any new schools, organisations or vocational centres being added in the future.

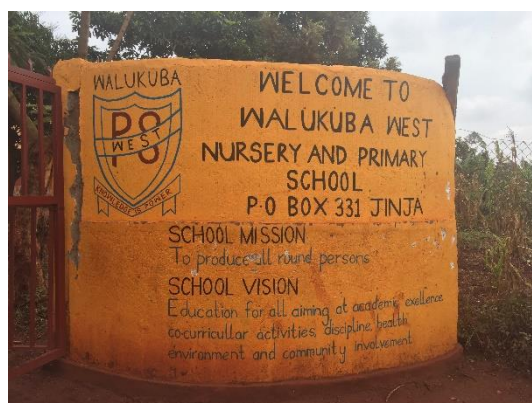

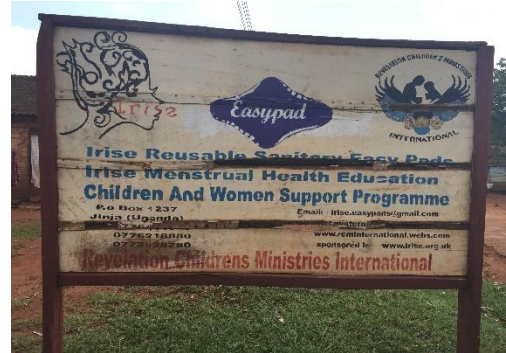
